

42. Further Description of Important Features HOUSES EXTERIOR IS WHITE STUCCO. ROOFS ARE GABLED WITH AN ARCHED SECTION OVER THE PORCH. A WINDOW IS INSET INTO THE ROOF LINE AT THE TOP OF THE ARCHED PORTION. THE LIVING ROOM HAS A GROUP(S) OF UNUSUAL WINDOWS FACING THE STREET. THE WINDOWS CONSIST OF 1/2 LITE / 2 LITE / 1 LITE. BRICK IS INSET IN THE EXTERIOR WALL OVER THE WINDOWS FOR DECORATION. THE LARGE GABLED ROOF FACING THE STREET IS BRACKETED AT 4 POINTS. 

43. History and Significance BUILT BY JACOB WEISHEIMER WHO ALSO BUILT THE HOME UP THE STREET WHICH IS ASSOCIATED WITH THE OLD FLOUR MILL. THE WEISHEIMERS OWNED THE HOME UNTIL 1967 WHEN IT WAS SOLD TO THE SNYDER FAMILY.
JAMES HALVERSON BOUGHT THE HOUSE IN 1972

44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings THERE IS A GARAGE TO THE REAR PROBABLY OF THE SAME PERIOD. HOUSE LOT HAS SEVERAL LARGE TREES. SURROUNDING AREA IS RESIDENTIAL.
