oldest structure in commercial area of North Columbus, listed in 1899 City Directory as A.B. West, barber and located on 1899 Baist Real Estate. Structure has been used continuously since then (1899) as a barber shop under a variety of management and owners. Possibly used as barber shop prior to 1890s.

43. (Cont'd)

Columbus. Building may represent the last and only remaining commercial structure built prior to building boom of Civil War North Columbus.
