any damages arising from such use and maintenance; that said grantee, upon notice from the city of Columbus, shall forthwith remove said pipe line and restore said street and sidewalk to their original condition without cost to said city; provided further, that said grant is made with the understanding that the occupancy of said street and sidewalk by said gasoline line is permitted merely as an accommodation and that no right, title or interest of the public is abridged thereby; and provided further, that the grantee shall pay the cost of the publication of this ordinance.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law upon said grantee filing with the clerk of said council his acceptance in writing of each and all of the terms, provisions and requirements of this ordinance; provided, however, that if such grantee shall fail to file said written acceptance and pay the costs of publication hereof, within thirty days after the passage thereof, then this ordinance shall be of no force and effect.

AN ORDINANCE No. 218-31—To provide for the payment of a pension to Abe Clark, an employee of the division of water, for the remainder of the year 1931.

AN ORDINANCE No. 219-31—To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into contracts for the purchase of bread and meat for use in the division of workhouse.

Whereas, an emergency exists in that the contracts for the first half of the year 1931, for furnishing bread and meat for prisoners confined at the workhouse will expire June 30, 1931; therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and is hereby authorized to advertise for bids, and contract for, the purchase of approximately 50,000 pounds of bread for use at the workhouse, to pay for which the sum of \$1900 is hereby appropriated from division 41, fund B3-4, and approximately 8,000 pounds of beef for use at the workhouse, to pay for which the sum of \$950 is hereby appropriated from division 41, fund B3-4.

Sec. 2. That for the reason stated in the preamble hereto this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

## RESOLUTION

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Columbus:

a. That it is necessary to improve Lowell road from Broad street to Maryland avenue, by grading, draining, curbing, paving the roadway with brick or asphalt, erecting street signs, lowering water mains, and laying necessary water services and sewer connections, in the city of Columbus, Ohio; in accordance with the plans, profiles, specification and estimates of the proposed improvement prepared by the engineer, which are hereby approved.

b. That the grade of said street shall be as shown on the plans and profiles to-wit: No. 1073 Dr. D of the files of the chief engineer of the department of public service which are, by reference, made a part hereof.

c. That the whole cost of said improvement, less one-fiftieth thereof and the cost of intersections, shall be assessed in proportion to the special benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement, and lot 1 of Broadleigh East, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement, and in an amount to be determined.

d. That the assessment so to be levied shall be paid in ten annual installments, with interest on deferred payments at a rate not exceeding six per cent per annum; provided that the owner of any property assessed may, at his option, pay such assessment or any number of installments of the same at any time after such assessment has been levied, with interest to the semi-annual interest day of said bonds next following date of payment.

e. That bonds of the city of Columbus, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments by installments, and in an amount equal thereto.

f. That the remainder of the entire cost of said improvement shall be paid from street construction and repaving No. 103 fund.

g. That said improvement is hereby declared to be conducive to the public health, convenience and welfare.

## EXAMINATION

Notice is hereby given of the following examination to be held at Central high school building, Friday, June 26, 1931, at 9 o'clock a. m.:

Patrolman, division of police, department of public safety.

Salary, \$150 to \$160 per month. No fee.

Duties: To preserve the public peace; maintain law and order; protect life and property; prevent crime; bring to justice persons violating the law; obey commands of superior officers.

Qualifications: Must possess executive ability; be alert and courteous; good judgment and neat appearance. Age, at time of appointment, from 25 to 35 years. Height, minimum, 5 feet 9 inches; weight, 150 pounds.

Note: Physical examination by police surgeon will be required prior to mental examination. Fee of \$1.00 payable to the surgeon at time of physical examination.

### General Information

All applicants must be citizens of the United States and legal residents of the city of Columbus, Ohio, for one year last past.

All applicants must be of good moral character, temperate habits, sound health and physically able to perform the duties of the position sought.

The subjects of mental examination will be experience and practical questions, together with an oral examination.

The term of eligibility of eligible lists is fixed at not less than one year nor more than two years.

Application blanks may be procured at the office of the civil service commission in the city hall, room 220, and must be filed in that office not later than 4 o'clock p. m., Friday, June 12, 1931. Applications received after that time will be held for the next examination.

# Clintonville once was home to golf courses

■ *Development eventually overtook upscale Wyandot Golf Club and not-so-upscale Indian Springs course.*

**P**erhaps you don't remember but Clintonville was the home of two golf courses in the late '40s and early '50s and back beyond that time. One was the Wyandot Country Club Golf Course which stretched from High Street to Indianola Avenue, just north of Morse Road where the state blind school is now. It was one of Columbus' finest courses rivaling York Country Club in beauty and difficulty.

The other was Indian Springs which also stretched from High Street to Indianola between East Schreyer and Cooke Road. Indian Springs was not a first class course but

in about 1947 a group of investors — Omen, Petit and Meinhardt — bought it and attempted to restore it to at least a semblance of its old glory. They never quite succeeded but they and I tried. I say "I," because I once worked there, as well as at Wyandot. It was during the summers of 1945 and '46 when I was in my late teens.

The manager Omen and Petit chose was a neighbor of mine, Clyde Hodgson. Clyde knew nothing about running a golf course as far as I know although he did like to play golf. He hired me and two other fellows I knew who along with me went to North High School.

There also was a young school dropout whose name I forget who sort of came with the place, and who was what I'd call a rough diamond. We couldn't have run the place without him. He could fix anything, do anything and had an absolute talent for finding lost golf balls. In a half hour he could find as many as 40 balls which he sold to Clyde for "reprocessing." The other two, my schoolmates, were Gibbs Kugel and Bob Wagner. We weren't nearly as

good as Mr. Rough Diamond was at finding lost balls, but we certainly tried.

Clyde eventually hired a head groundskeeper, a colorful man who

claimed to be an American Indian, who seemed to know nothing but how to water and "whip" the greens clear of dew in the morning. We couldn't have known it but he was a genius at making the course come alive in vivid green and at curing all kinds of diseases the greens seemed to be subject to in those days of recreating Indian Springs.

At Wyandot I was the locker room boy; I was in charge of cleaning the locker room and serving hamburgers and beer to the hungry golfers at the 19th hole.

I also had a shoe shine business on the side. One of my shoe shine customers was Fred Hope, Bob Hope's brother. Bob sometimes played Wyandot with him. I didn't get out on the course much as I worked 60 hours a week there and I was glad to get home at the end of the day.

The pro at Wyandot was Al Marchi, an Italian-American and a grand guy and a good golf pro. He once volunteered to give me golf lessons free but I was already spending too much time there and I wanted to get home to be with my school friends. I turned him down — what a mistake! But then I was only 16 and had no idea what I was missing.

The pro at Indian Springs was Joe Thomas, an original Professional Golfers Association member and a fine pro. Joe only recently died. He lived to his 90s.

Our one piece of mechanized equipment at Indian Springs was an old converted model A Ford. It had been "geared low" and served as a tractor. It had no brakes, which reminds me of the day it got away from Gibbs and was rolling downhill backwards with him at the wheel. His eyes, normally only slits, were wide open with

unbridled terror. Nothing happened so it remains in my memory as a very funny incident.

My first year at Indian Springs was largely made up of trying to rescue the clubhouse from obscurity. The stove, pots, pans and grills were black with grease which I scraped for days on end cutting the ground-in grease with gasoline. A very dirty job, but I eventually got it done, sort of. The stove never quite

got clean but it was eventually usable. One day while we were cutting the greens with a noisy hand-driven mower some women attempted to "play through." I'm sure they called *fore* but Bob Wagener didn't hear them and a ball went right through his high pompadour hair. He had freckles and a ruddy complexion and I remember him turning absolutely white when it happened.

There was a driving range at High Street at Indian Springs. Golfers hit their balls to the east sort of uphill. The range was roughly where the post office is now. It was quite a popular driving range in those days but those using it as well as golfers using the course had to be careful not to hit into the houses whose back windows faced the golf course. I broke a window once. My golfing partners all ran but I went up to the owner and apologized and offered to pay for the window; nobody hurt, luckily.

Clyde eventually fired the colorful head greens keeper saying that he himself could water the greens, which was all he thought the man did. Of course, that wasn't all he did and the course with its impossible rough and only passable fairways and greens went downhill from that time on. Finally, of course, it became too valuable not to turn into a development and many fine houses now stand where the fairways once were.

I'll bet you could still find some golf balls in some of the backyards there.

U. S. G. A. Rules Govern Play With Exception of the Following:

Ball out of bounds and lost ball, one stroke penalty. Ball in lake, loss of distance only. Unplayable lie, stroke and distance. Ball in creek, lift out, one stroke penalty. Drop ball back of water values, no penalty.

**Out of Bounds**

No. 1 Between steps and White stake right of Green.

No. 12 Left of stakes.

No. 13 Left of stakes.

No. 16-17-18 Right of stakes.

Ladies not permitted to play course on Saturday afternoon until 3:10 P. M. Prohibited Sunday or Holiday mornings.


Singles and more than fourtimes have no standing and must always give way to a properly constituted match.

Players cutting in at No. 9-10 or 16 must give way to those playing regular course.

Slow matches as well as players hunting lost balls should observe etiquette of Golf and invite faster matches to go through without being asked.

Smooth sand after playing out of traps.

Replace the turf. It's your Course, protect it.

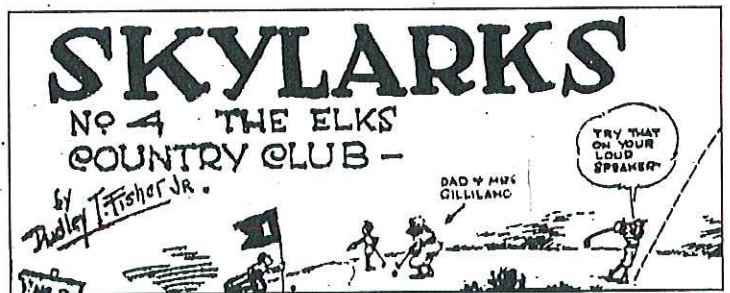
