In celebration of the band's 20th anniversary in 2004, Bob Lackey, president, initiated the idea and the implementation of commissioning a composer to write a composition highlighting Clintonville. With a recommendation from Mr. Susi, we commissioned Dr. Barry Kopetz, who finished the composition a few weeks ago.

The Clintonville Community Band (CCB) was formed in 1984 by Les Susi when he called North and Whetstone High School Band Alumni together for a practice to perform at the twenty five (25) year rededication of the Whetstone Recreation Center.

The Band formerly known as The North Columbus Community Band, which changed its name to The Clintonville Community Band in 1996, offers adults of all ages the opportunity to continue practicing and performing a variety of musical literature beyond formal study. Originally the band consisted of North and Whetstone High School graduates, but soon grew to include musicians from throughout Columbus and the surrounding areas. The members range in age from late teens through the senior years, and vary in musical training from novice to retired university music professor. The CCB rehearses every Wednesday evening at 7:30 P.M. in the Whetstone High School band room and has about 60 active members. The membership in the band is composed of several former and current band directors, dentists, attorneys, physicians, insurance agents, computer specialists, engineers, teachers, nurses, etc.

The CCB performs at many retirement homes, The Park of Roses Summer Concert Series, North on the Fourth, The Ohio State Fair, several retirement communities and the annual Christmas Concert at the old North High School.

The CCB is under the direction of Mr. Richard Burkart, who is also the Instrumental Music Director at Whetstone High School.

The CCB is registered with the Internal Revenue Service as a not for profit 501(c)(3) organization and relies on donations to meet our expenses for music, instrument and repairs. Your consideration would greatly be appreciated.
