 be saved.'" He did believe. I left him that  
 night, after reading other scriptures to him,  
 with a new hope—not based on what he had  
 done, but believing what God says about what  
 Christ had done.  
 I called the next morning to see him. As I  
 entered he looked up with joy in his face and  
 said, "Oh, I'll have a song now!" It will be,  
 "Unto Him that loved us, and washed us from  
 our sins in His own blood."  
 He was with us about a week more, and  
 fell asleep happy in the Lord.  
 Reader, will you be able to sing that song?  
 or will you have to say, "I am tormented in  
 this flame"? It will be one or the other. "He  
 that believeth and is baptized shall be saved,  
 but he that believeth not shall be damned."  
 (Mark xvi. 16.) Again, "He that believeth on  
 the Son hath everlasting life, and he that be-  
 lieveth not the Son shall not see life, but the  
 wrath of God abideth on him." (Jno. iii.  
 36.) And again, "Verily, verily, I say unto  
 you, He that heareth My word, and believeth  
 on Him that sent Me, hath everlasting life,  
 and shall not come into judgment, but is  
 passed from death unto life." (Jno. v. 24.)

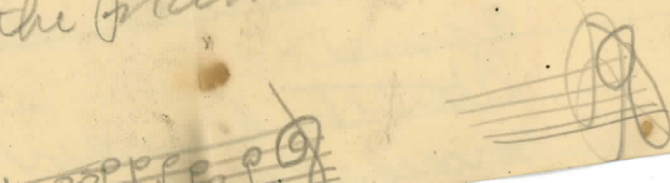

Jan 1916 completely.

large. 4) Preferential voting  
(May Anne Miller) 5) Initiative

term of office 7) Merit system  
in City Civil Service 8) Public  
Welfare Division created  
9) Public Dependence 10) The Board  
of Purchase buys all city  
supplies. 11) Mayor's veto  
only forces reconsideration

### Legislative

Except for Init. & Ref.  
legislative power vested in

2 yrs.
