DAIRY BARN BURNED.

Cows Saved With Difficulty From the Flames-Loss \$900.

The big dairy barn of Jerry Welsh on High street, above Clintonville, was totally destroyed by fire Tuesday afternoon, together with a stock of fodder. In the barn at the time the blaze was discovered were zbout 20 cows and some horses. All the animals were finally removed, though Welsh and his neighbors had a lively time of it taking the frantic beasts from the fiery furnace.

Luckily there was little, if any, wind and thus other outbuildings and the house were saved.

There was no means of fighting the fire, and all that could be done was to run to the neighbors' for buckets of water to pour upon the house. About 600 tons of millet was burned. The loss on the property will be about \$500.
