

Trailer Camp In License Squabble

Charges of operating a trailer camp without a license have been filed against Flora Louise Hess, 2637 Olentangy River Rd, County Health Commissioner H. R. Mitchell said Friday.

The health officer said his department had refused to issue a license to Miss Hess because she had failed to comply with county sanitary requirements.

He said the charges were filed by Howard Reynolds, county sanitary officer, in the court of Justice of Peace Hubert Brown, 2494 Olentangy River Rd.

Dr. Mitchell said he hoped a hearing on the charges will be delayed until after the summer quarter at Ohio State University is over, since most of the trailers in Miss Hess' camp are occupied by University students. University officials have requested that the charges be held in abeyance until the end of the summer quarter.

Dr. Mitchell said plans are being made to use the Ohio State Grounds as a trailer camp for University students this fall. It is also hoped that the Veterans' Village housing project on Lane Av near the campus will be completed by September.

Unlicensed Camp Owner Convicted

Convicted by a criminal court jury on a charge of operating a trailer camp without a license, Flora Louise Hess, 2637 Olentangy River Rd, was fined \$100 and costs Friday by Judge Joseph M. Clifford.

Execution of the sentence was postponed pending an appeal. Miss Hess was not in the courtroom when sentence was pronounced and defense counsel Carrington T. Marshall told the court he had failed in repeated efforts to find her.

The county health department refused to issue a license to Miss Hess because her trailer camp did not meet minimum health requirements. When she continued to operate the camp without a license, the health commissioner filed charges against her.
