History and Significance (Continue on Reverse if necessary) Built in 1949 as the residence of Virginia Snavely, a librarian at Ohio State University [There was no listing for this address in 1949, but 214 first appears in 1950 Directory] Lustron Corporation of Columbus was the nation's largest manufacturer of prefabricated buildings, successfully capitalizing on the pent-up demand for inexpensive, rapidly assembled housing after WW II. From 1948-1951 over 3,500 houses were manufactured until the company was forced to foreclose. 44.
